


This booklet uses easy words and pictures.

You might want to ask someone to help you read it.





You need a blood test.



You will go to the phlebotomy department.










One of the hospital staff will help you.

You may be offered some cream for your skin.


Some people like this.

It stops them from feeling the blood test.


You will sit in the waiting room until it's your turn.



The nurse will then put a needle into your arm.




You will feel a scratch in your arm.
